

# 24 HOURS: A PHOTOGRAPHIC INTERPRETATION OF LIFE IN THE ADIRONDACKS

### **PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST**

Give us your best shot! The Lake Placid Institute for the Arts & Humanities invites high school students to participate in the annual photography contest, capturing a visual interpretation of their surroundings.

#### **GUIDELINES**

- Eligibility: Students who reside or attend school in counties located (or partially located) in the Adirondack Park during the 2024-2025 school year are eligible. Students must be enrolled in Grades 9-12 (including public, private, or home schooling).
- Color or Black & White photos must be taken within the Adirondack Park and represent one hour of the day.
- Each student may submit up to 2 entries.
- Each photo must be accompanied by a short, 50-150 word essay describing the photographer's vision and what inspired them to take the photo.
- All entries must include the following information:
  - Student's Name
  - School
  - Grade
  - Supervising Teacher's Name and Email Address
  - Title of photo
  - Date the photo was taken
  - Hour the photo was taken
  - Location of the photo
  - Type of camera used
  - "About the Artist" Bio (optional)
- Photos must be able to be replicated in an 8" x 10" format.

Submissions that do not meet these requirements will not be accepted.

#### **Selected Photos**

- Three photos will be selected as 1st, 2nd and 3rd place overall winners, receiving \$500, \$300 and \$100 respectively.
- Photos will also be selected for Honorable Mention and/or Juror's Choice.
- Selected photos will be prepared for exhibition and displayed at the Lake Placid Center for the Arts during the High School Art Show (April 11 – May 17, 2025). Closing Celebration: Friday, May 2, 4-6 pm.
- All photographers whose work is selected for exhibition will receive a book of the 2024-2025 selected photographs.
